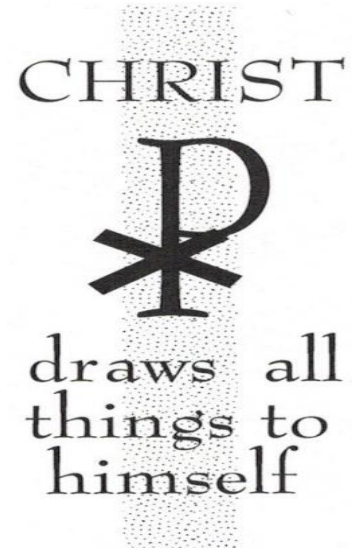

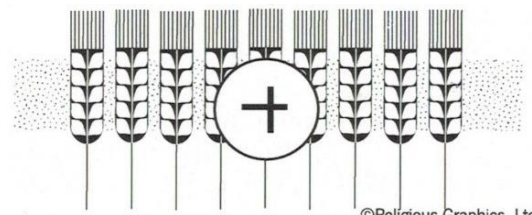

"How I would love to know you!" Once there was a salt doll who lived so far inland that she had never seen the sea.
