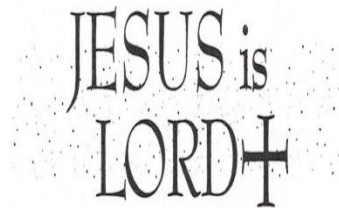

“I had an hour of Glory on a windswept hill.” Dr. William Stidger once told of a lovely little 90-year-old lady named Mrs. Sampson. Mrs. Sampson was frail, feeble, even sickly. But Dr. Stidger said that when he was discouraged, he always went to visit Mrs. Sampson. She had a radiant spirit that was contagious. One day he asked this 90-year-old woman, *“What is the secret of your power? What keeps you happy, contented and cheerful through your sickness?”* She answered with a line from a poem, *“I had an hour of Glory on a windswept hill.”* Bill Stidger said, recounting this experience, *“I knew she had been in touch with God and that was the whole reason for her cheerfulness.”*— Listen again to her words: *“an hour of Glory on a windswept hill.”* It sounds very much like the experience Peter, James and John had on the Mount of Transfiguration.
