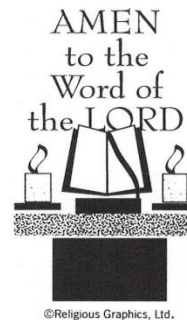

**How to Live to Be 100... or More.** One of the most beloved entertainers of all time was the comedian George Burns. He died in Beverly Hills on March 9, 1996. He was 100 years old. When he was in his nineties he wrote a book entitled *How to Live to Be 100... or More*. In the book he has a chapter with the heading, "*Stay Away from Funerals, Especially Yours.*" George Burns said, "*If you look in the obituary column in the morning, and your name isn't there, go ahead and have breakfast.*" He said that if he ever looked in the obituary column and found his name was there, he would go ahead and have breakfast anyway because he said, "*I'm not leaving on an empty stomach.*" —

Now, that kind of sense of humor kept George Burns young at heart for all of his 100 years. But the fact is that we are all going to die... and even more painful is the fact that people we love are going to die... and that can fill us with despair.
