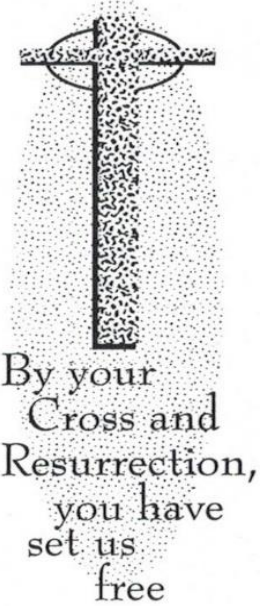

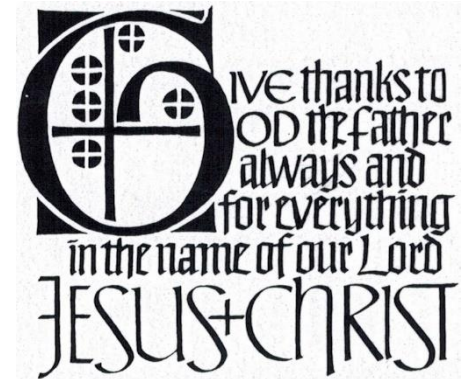
“I HAD AN HOUR OF GLORY ON A WINDSWEPT HILL.” Dr. William Stidger once told of a lovely little 90-year-old lady named Mrs. Sampson. Mrs. Sampson was frail, feeble, even sickly. But Dr. Stidger said that when he was discouraged, he always went to visit Mrs. Sampson. She had a radiant spirit that was contagious.

One day he asked this 90-year-old woman, “*What is the secret of your power? What keeps you happy, contented and cheerful through your sickness?*” She answered with a line from a poem, “*I had an hour of glory on a windswept hill.*” Bill Stidger said, recounting this experience, “*I knew she had been in touch with God and that was the whole reason for her cheerfulness.*” (King Duncan)

Listen again to her words: “*an hour of glory on a windswept hill.*” It sounds very much like the experience Peter, James and John had on the Mount of Transfiguration. (Matthew 17.1-9). This week’s gospel recounts that event in the life of the three disciples closest to Jesus in His life and ministry. Sometimes we refer to significant moments in life as “*mountaintop experiences.*” Many of us have had such experiences, a time when God seemed very close. It may have been on an actual mountain, by a seaside, an ordinary day in our life or even in a liturgical celebration, like at Mass!
